The D-8 Research Centre for Agriculture and Food security in Faisalabad, Pakistan provides us an excellent opportunity to further the agenda agreed upon at this meeting.

We are equally hopeful that the Dhaka Initiatives will also provide useful guidance for our experts to address issues in implementing the proposed projects, including through collaboration with international and regional organizations such as Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), and Islamic Development Bank (IsDB), International Rice Research Institute (IRRI) and International Maize and Wheat Improvement Centre (CIMMTY).

Distinguished Delegates, Ladies and Gentlemen,

At this juncture, I want to use this opportunity to thank all our participants, once again, for their unwavering commitment and also our resource persons for the quality of their presentations. What we look forward to is the adoption of the outcome of documents arising from this meeting and their implementation by Member States.

In concluding my remarks, **Excellencies and Distinguished Delegates**, I would like to urge our Member States to continue to place agriculture and food security on our priority development agenda and to pursue it vigorously at all levels and sub sectors, including Climate Smart Agriculture.

Our experts and officials must come up with tangible feasibility studies, viable action plans and concrete projects to put into action the decision and recommendations of this Ministerial Meeting. I strongly
