## **D-8 Facts Sheet**

## BACKGROUND

D-8, as an intergovernmental organization, comprising Bangladesh, Egypt, Indonesia, Iran, Malaysia, Nigeria, Pakistan and Turkey, based on friendship, solidarity and pursuit of sustainable economic growth, endowed with abundant human and natural resources, aspires to become a economic power house promoting sustainable development of its member states, as well as be a major actor in the global economic governance and system, and international economic cooperation. The total GDP of D-8 Member States is around 4.9% of world GDP and the total population around 15.3% of world population.

The idea of cooperation among major Muslim developing countries was mooted by Prof. Dr. Necmettin Erbakan, the then Prime Minister of Turkey, during a Seminar on "Cooperation in Development" which was held in Istanbul in October 1996.

## **ESTABLISHMENT**

The establishment of D-8 was announced officially through the Istanbul Declaration of Summit of Heads of State/Government on **June 15**, **1997**.

### D-8 PRINCIPLES

According to the first Summit Declaration (Istanbul, 1997), the main objective of D-8 is declared to be socio-economic development in accordance with following principles:

- Peace instead of conflict.
- Dialogue instead of confrontation.
- Cooperation instead of exploitation.
- Iustice instead of double-standard
- · Equality instead of discrimination.
- Democracy instead of oppression.


