

CAIRO DECLARATION 2024

We, the Heads of State and Government/Representatives of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the Arab Republic of Egypt, the Republic of Indonesia, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Malaysia, the Federal Republic of Nigeria, the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, and the Republic of Türkiye, forming the membership of the Developing-8 Organization for Economic Cooperation (D-8), gathered in Cairo on 19 December 2024, on the occasion of our Eleventh Summit, being held under the theme, "Investing in Youth and Supporting SMEs: Shaping Tomorrow's Economy."

Reiterating our pledge to advance our shared development goals under the principles of fraternity, peace, dialogue, justice, equality, rule of law, and democracy, established during the founding of the D-8, as encapsulated in our previous Summit Declarations.

Acknowledging our past progress should serve as a catalyst to renew our focus and intensify our efforts in addressing today's challenges, particularly in the light of the evolving global landscape.

Reiterating the value of unity, equality, mutual respect, and economic cooperation, we reaffirm our commitment to advancing partnerships in priority areas of cooperation, including agriculture and food security, energy, science, technology, industry, development of small and medium enterprises, infrastructure, trade, investment and transportation, to promote inclusive and equitable development that benefits our nations.

Reaffirming our shared endeavor to implement the D-8 Decennial Roadmap for 2020-2030 to deepen further economic cooperation, aligned with UN Development Agenda.

Reaffirming our faith in multilateralism and the importance of enhanced cooperation within the D-8 framework and with relevant regional and international organizations, particularly the United Nations, and the Standing Committee for Economic and Commercial Cooperation of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (COMCEC) including strengthening South-South Cooperation, that is vital for promoting sustainable development, fostering peace, and addressing global challenges such as poverty, climate change, and inequality.

Realizing that the full and Organization-wide operationalization of the Preferential Trade Agreement Among D-8 Member States (D-8 PTA), the Multilateral Agreement among D-8 Member Countries on Administrative Assistance in Customs Matters (D-8 Customs Agreement), the Agreement on "Simplification of Visa Procedures, for the Businessmen of the D-8 Member States" (D-8 Visa Agreement) and transformation of the D-8 PTA into a more progressive instrument, such as a comprehensive economic partnership agreement will propel our economic power to a new height.



Emphasizing the need to promote investment opportunities and to increase intra D-8 trade with efficient mechanisms including on-line platforms, while also committing to inclusive growth, through the promotion of micro, small, and medium-sized enterprises (MSMEs) in emerging sectors such as digital trade, e-commerce, and fintech, to ensure economic empowerment for all and intensifying efforts in improving logistics, transport, and regulatory frameworks.

Reaffirming our commitment to advancing cooperation in science, technology, and innovation through the existing mechanisms, to study key indicators and assess digital transformation opportunities, including emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence (AI) and the Internet of Things (IoT), to support our objectives.

Highlighting the importance of addressing climate change in the context of sustainable development and poverty eradication.

Recalling decision 14/30 of UNCBD COP14 on cooperation with other conventions, international organizations and initiatives, adopted at the fourteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity, in which the parties welcomed the initiative of the Government of Egypt to promote a coherent approach between the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, the Convention on Biological Diversity and the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification, to address biodiversity loss, climate change and land and ecosystem degradation.

Emphasizing the importance of promoting sustainable agricultural practices, as part of our collective endeavors to ensure food security and safety.

Acknowledging all Member States' participation in the Organization's activities must be strengthened, under the principle of fraternity and dialogue among members, in expanding our cooperation to achieve our shared objectives, and to that end.

We hereby,

- 1. **Appreciate** and commend the People's Republic of Bangladesh for its excellent stewardship and tireless efforts, since taking over the Chair's role in April 2021, which enabled the D-8 Member States to make significant progress in enhancing cooperation in our key areas of cooperation, as well as organizational expansion, visibility, and international collaboration and partnership, and **extend** our profound appreciation to the leadership of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, for their commitment and dedicated efforts in advancing the D-8 objectives, during their chairmanship of the Organization.
- 2. **Express** our heartfelt gratitude to **His Excellency Abdel Fattah-El-Sisi**, Honorable President of the Arab Republic of Egypt, as well as the Egyptian government and people,



for successfully hosting the 11th D-8 Summit, and providing such gracious hospitality, and as such, pledge our full support and wish His Excellency the President, tremendous success as the Chair of the D-8 Organization.

- 3. Acknowledge the commendable work of **His Excellency**, **Ambassador Isiaka Abdulqadir Imam**, the Secretary-General of the D-8, during his tenure, which commenced on 1 January 2022, and appreciate his determination and meaningful efforts over the last three years, including, in effectively, managing the D-8 Secretariat.
- 4. Welcome the fruitful collaboration with many national, regional, and international organizations, such as the United Nations, the United Nations Trade and Development (UNCTAD), the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO), the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), the World Trade Organization (WTO), the United Nations Tourism (UN Tourism), the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), the Islamic Development Bank (IsDB), the Islamic Organization for Food Security (IOFS), the Standards and Metrology Institute of the Islamic Countries (SMIIC), the Islamic Cooperation Youth Forum, the World Tourism Forum Institute, the Economic Cooperation Organization (ECO) and encourage a more profound and broader collaboration with these organizations, to get support necessary for the realization of initiatives and projects to achieve the D-8 objectives.
- 5. Applaud the establishment of the D-8 Youth Council, which the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh will host in Dhaka and call on Member States to support its functioning to foster youth cooperation in the D-8 and, in the same vein, appreciate the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, for hosting the First Ministerial Meeting on Youth on 22 May 2024, and look forward to the hosting of the Second Ministerial Meeting on Youth by Nigeria. Encourages the Member States to organize joint activities in the field of youth by taking best practices into account and invite the Secretariat to coordinate these activities within the framework of "the D-8 Cooperation Action Plan for Youth" to be prepared in line with the proposals of the Member States with reference to the Dhaka Declaration on Youth. Invites the Secretariat and Member States to continue to work in cooperation on the Constitution of the D-8 Youth Council until the Second Ministerial Meeting on Youth.
- 6. **Commend** the Arab Republic of Egypt for selecting "Investing in Youth and Supporting SMEs: Shaping Tomorrow's Economy" as the theme for this Summit, and welcome the initiative proposed by the Islamic Republic of Iran to establish a D-8 mechanism to support the innovative ideas of the D-8 youth, and Iran's readiness to hold exhibitions as well as



scientific/technological/entrepreneurship tours and specialized meetings with the participation of the youth from the D-8 Member States.

- 7. **Express** appreciation to the Government of the Federal Republic of Nigeria for their commitment to hosting the D-8 Center for Small and Medium Enterprises in Abuja, including the provision of initial resources to facilitate its operationalization. Recognizing the Center's potential to advance entrepreneurship and collaboration among D-8 Member States, we encourage the timely completion of its setup and call on all Member States to extend their support whether technical, financial or through capacity-building to ensure its effective and sustainable operation.
- 8. **Congratulate** the People's Republic of Bangladesh for organizing the Third Meeting of the D-8 Trade Ministers Council (3rd TMC) in Dhaka on 5 March 2024, as well as the Republic of Türkiye for hosting the Informal Meeting of the Trade Ministers Council of the D-8 Member States (Informal TMC) in Istanbul on 11 June 2024, which marked significant progress in advancing D-8 trade policies.
- 9. **Welcome** the announcement by the Arab Republic of Egypt to host the Fourth Meeting of the D-8 Trade Ministers Council in 2025, to further enhance existing D-8 trade policies especially through the participation and active engagement of SMEs; and to deliberate new mechanisms to expand and diversify trade among D-8 Member States, through digital trade facilitation platforms, e-commerce, and AI driven technologies.
- 10. **Welcome** the upcoming ratification by the Arab Republic of Egypt of the Preferential Trade Agreement Among D-8 Member States (D-8 PTA), marking the monumental milestone that all D-8 Member States are now Contracting Members of the D-8 PTA.
- 11. **Reiterate** the importance of effective implementation and operationalization of the D-8 PTA by all Contracting Members, including organizing capacity-building programs for relevant officials and appreciate that five Contracting Members have completed their internal procedures, to implement the D-8 PTA and call on those ready, to commence trading, under the framework of the D-8 PTA, without delay, to achieve the collective target of its value to at least 10% of the D-8 total external trade value, or at least US\$ 500 billion, by 2030, as outlined in the D-8 Decennial Roadmap for 2020-2030, and welcome the proposal to expand the D-8 PTA scope to meaningfully and equitably cover a wider array of significantly traded products, among the D-8 Member States, to make it more attractive to business entities.
- 12. **Acclaim** the adoption of the Dispute Settlement Mechanism (DSM) Protocol to the Preferential Trade Agreement Among D-8 Member States (D-8 PTA), during the 3rd TMC



in Dhaka on 5 March 2024 and its subsequent signing by Bangladesh, Indonesia, Iran, and Türkiye, during the Informal TMC in Istanbul, and call on the D-8 Trade Ministers Council to devise means to expedite the process for the Protocol's entry-into-force, as seamless and as most straightforward as possible.

- 13. **Note with keen interest** the discourse on the need to upgrade the D-8 PTA to a more progressive instrument, such as a comprehensive economic partnership agreement, to enable the D-8 to be a more dynamic, powerful, competitive, and impactful economic bloc, including to venturing into potential sectors for trade in services, in the next phase of cooperation and tasked the D-8 Trade Ministers Council to conduct a study, scoping exercise, and comparative analysis, to identify the modalities and way forward, for the expansion of the D-8 PTA.
- 14. **Applaud** the adoption of the D-8 Trade Facilitation Strategy, during the Third Meeting of the D-8 Trade Ministers Council, which serves as a guideline for the D-8 Member States to strengthen intra-D-8 trade, by facilitating more accessible trade measures and Customs procedures, and call upon prompt implementation among Member States.
- 15. **Congratulate** Nigeria for assuming the Chair of the Supervisory Committee of the D-8 PTA starting in May 2024 and thank Bangladesh for their role as the immediate past Chair of the Committee.
- 16. **Welcome** the proposal to strengthen broader economic cooperation, through regular meetings of the economic ministers and their subsequent technical bodies of the D-8 Member States to provide a clear recommendation on crucial economic cooperation, including various novel ideas, to further promote the achievement of the D-8 economic objectives.
- 17. **Underline** the tremendous potentials of halal economy and commit to work together in boosting collaboration in this sector through capacity building initiatives and exchange of best practices to support the development of SMEs in halal industries.
- 18. **Direct** the D-8 Secretariat to conduct studies to devise ways to facilitate easier movement of businesspeople, among the D-8 Member States, guided by the Agreement on Simplification of Visa Procedures for Businessmen of the D-8 Member States.
- 19. **Emphasize** the importance of enhancing agricultural productivity, improving food security, and fostering rural development through joint initiatives, agricultural innovation, resilient agri-food systems, including sustainable farming techniques, sustainable land and water management practices, and the adoption of modern agricultural technologies, while



reaffirming our commitment to fostering agricultural trade and strengthening food supply chains among us, while highlighting the need to increase resilience to external shocks, such as climate change, pandemics, and geopolitical disruptions, and to that end, commend the 7th D-8 Ministerial Meeting on Agriculture and Food Security hosted virtually by the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh in Dhaka on 13 January 2022.

- 20. **Commend** efforts by the D-8 Research Center for Agriculture and Food Security (D-8 RCAFS) in Faisalabad, Pakistan, in organizing activities and training programs, under the joint action plan, signed with the Islamic Organization for Food Security (IOFS).
- 21. **Commit** to enhancing cooperation in sustainable tourism, cultural exchange, and heritage preservation, to promote mutual understanding and socio-economic development, as tourism is a vital economic sector, for D-8 Member States and, for such a purpose, encourage Member States to develop joint initiatives, to boost intra-D-8 tourism, such as simplifying visa procedures, improving regional tourism infrastructures, and implementing collaborative marketing strategies.
- 22. **Welcome** the announcement by the Arab Republic of Egypt to host the fourth D-8 Ministerial Meeting on Tourism in Aswan, in 2025, and congratulate the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, for successfully hosting the Third D-8 Ministerial Meeting on Tourism on 5 August 2023.
- 23. **Commend** the D-8 Secretariat for successfully launching the inaugural D-8 Tourism City of the Year Award and congratulate the City of Antalya in the Republic of Türkiye, on its selection as the first D-8 Tourism City of the Year 2025, and express confidence that this initiative will boost tourism, encourage investment, infrastructure development, and cultural exchange, while promoting healthy competition among Member States, and to that end, call on all Member States to support this important initiative and promote travel to Antalya in 2025.
- 24. **Acknowledge** the need to enhance cooperation in the energy sector, including through engagement with the relevant international organizations, to promote the development and application of energy-efficient technologies and renewable energy and to foster private sector investment in new and renewable energy, to assist our countries in their pathways to just transition.
- 25. **Commend** the Organization's effort to improve cooperation in enhancing connectivity, including a more substantive collaboration in air connectivity and civil aviation, and appreciate the Republic of Indonesia for hosting the 12th meeting of the Director General and Experts Working Group on Civil Aviation (DGCA) in Bali, Indonesia, from 20 21



October 2022, and the Republic of Türkiye, for hosting the 13th D-8 Meeting of the DGCA in Antalya, Türkiye, from 12 – 14 November 2024.

- 26. **Emphasize** that measures taken to combat climate change, including unilateral ones, should not constitute a means of arbitrary or unjustifiable discrimination or a disguised restriction on international trade.
- 27. Call for allocating adequate, predictable and accessible finance from developed to developing countries, for just energy transition, in line with the principles of Common but Differentiated Responsibilities and Respective Capabilities CBDR-RC. Stressing that new industrial development models associated with this transition would require enormous investments in existing and new infrastructure.
- 28. **Underline** the importance of an ocean-based economy to support our shared objectives, while prioritizing the protection of marine biodiversity, promoting sustainable fisheries management, and ensuring the conservation of critical habitats to sustain livelihoods and ecological health by harnessing cooperation in fisheries and aquaculture, renewable ocean energy, seaports and shipping, marine biotechnology, offshore hydrocarbons and seabed minerals, deep sea mining, including through public-private-partnership, to attract investment in this sector.
- 29. **Encourage** cooperation, among D-8 Member States' academic communities and commend the D-8 Secretariat for establishing the D-8 Network of Pioneers for Research and Innovation (D-8 NPRI), chaired by COMSATS University in Islamabad, Pakistan, which, to date, is participated by 28 prominent universities from six Member States, and encourage the remaining Member States to invite their research-focused universities to participate, to enable the NPRI to play a more significant role in promoting innovation and research as well as advancing commercialization and project-based development, share of experience in developing research strategy, and visit to various research institutions, across all Member States, and as such, we commend the University of Ilorin of Nigeria, for hosting the Third Meeting of the D-8 NPRI in Ilorin, Nigeria, in November 2024.
- 30. **Welcome** the Arab Republic of Egypt's initiative to establish the D-8 Network for Economic Think Tanks, to serve as a platform for sharing information, exchanging ideas, and enhancing partnerships among think tanks in order to develop informed solutions to the pressing economic development challenges, facing the D-8 Member States, foster economic cooperation and trade, promote the sharing of best practices in economic development, and enhance capacity building in areas such as trade facilitation, entrepreneurship, innovation and digital economy and trade.



- 31. **Commend** the cooperation in human resource development, including the institutionalization of Diplomatic Training for the Diplomats from the D-8 Member States, which will serve as an investment for the future, by promoting networking from an early stage and noted with utmost appreciation to Bangladesh, Pakistan, and Türkiye, for already organizing diplomatic training, in their respective institutions, and call on other Member States to organize similar programs.
- 32. **Welcome** the Arab Republic of Egypt's initiative to establish a network for diplomatic institutes and academies in D-8 Member States to foster cooperation among them through [EG] creating a platform for regular dialogue on emerging issues in diplomatic and foreign policy training, encouraging the exchange of ideas among institutes, coordinating on the development of cutting-edge training programs, enhancing the quality and relevance of courses and programs offered by participating institutes, and creating a virtual space for joint discussions on topics such as development, economic diplomacy, food security, energy, trade policies, and climate change.
- 33. **Applaud** the commendable efforts of the D-8 Technology Transfer and Exchange Network (D-8 TTEN) in Tehran, in fostering cooperation among D-8 countries, through encouraging transfer of technology and the exchange of best practices and recognize the significant impact of regular events, organized by D-8 TTEN, such as the Technology Investment Meeting (TIM), the Business & Technology Meeting (BTM), and the Technology Transfer Award (TTA), in promoting innovation and collaboration. Furthermore, we commend the forward-looking proposals put forth by D-8 TTEN, including the D-8 AI initiative and the D-8 Co-Fund Initiative (D-8 CoFI), which aim to strengthen technological advancement and investment, within the D-8 community and call on Member States, to actively engage in and support these initiatives, for the collective progress of our nations.
- 34. **Welcome** the Collaborative Education Initiative by the Arab Republic of Egypt, to strengthen educational and scientific collaboration among D-8 Member States, through establishing a periodic online competition for university and vocational students in the fields of artificial intelligence, engineering, science and applied technology with the aim to enhance student engagement through the recognition of their skills, and to foster innovation by encouraging students to develop creative solutions to global and regional challenges.
- 35. **Highlight** the huge potential impacts of new and emerging technologies, including AI, on our peoples and economies, we instruct the ICT related Ministries in D-8 to seriously consider the optimal ways and means to utilize these technologies for enhanced resilience, nationally and collectively, against possible future shocks. In this regard, welcome the



proposal by the Islamic Republic of Iran that the upcoming meeting of the D-8 ICT Standing Committee, to be hosted by the Islamic Republic of Iran, should start working on the above instruction.

- 36. **Appreciate** the Islamic Republic of Iran for its continued support to the D-8 International University (D-8 IU) in Hamadan and commend the University for its efforts in expanding academic collaboration and fostering international research, through initiatives such as the 'International Bridge Initiative' and its diverse webinars and workshops, and encourage the Member States to support and contribute into its programs and activities.
- 37. Call on the D-8 Chambers of Commerce and Industry (D-8 CCI), to play a more significant role in strengthening economic cooperation, particularly trade and other business activities, through enhancing the productivity and competitiveness of the private sector and facilitating and coordinating business activities, by supporting innovation, investment, and entrepreneurship, as well as promoting cross-border trade and economic cooperation among Member States, and for such an objective, encourage the D-8 CCI to increase business-to-business engagement, among all D-8 Member States, by conducting business forums, one-on-one business matchmakings, business missions, and exchange of information on business opportunities.
- 38. **Welcome** the hosting by the Arab Republic of Egypt of the Fourth General Assembly of the D-8 CCI on the 17th of December 2024, which witnessed the handover of the D-8 CCI Chairmanship from Bangladesh to Egypt.
- 39. **Applaud** the D-8 Health and Social Protection Program (D-8 HSP) for carrying out a study on the revitalization of the therapeutic goods health market and hosting the First D-8 Forum on SME and Health in Abuja on 26-27 October 2022, and encourage Member States to promote trade in healthcare, particularly in pharmaceutical goods to ensure equitable access to health care and health products, and at the same time call on D-8 HSP, the D-8 TTEN, the D-8 NPRI, and the D-8 IU, to work together towards promotion of inter-state knowledge sharing, collaborative initiatives in health technology, and pharmaceutical innovation. In this regard Member States can work towards harmonizing their regulatory framework in line with the World Health Organization (WHO) standards and undertake knowledge sharing, as well as collaborative initiatives in health technology and pharmaceutical innovation through mutual recognition agreements (MRAs).
- 40. **Welcome** the proposal by the Arab Republic of Egypt to strengthen D-8 health cooperation, through regular convening of meetings of health ministers and the subsequent technical bodies of the D-8 Member States and welcome the announcement by the Arab Republic of



Egypt to host the first D-8 Ministerial Meeting on Health, in 2025, to discuss measures to advance preventative, therapeutic and rehabilitative health care, and to accelerate universal health coverage in D-8 Member States, through the inclusion of women and youth, not only as recipients of health care, but also as partners, in health policy making and implementation, including through utilizing digital technology and emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence.

- 41. **Encourage** the Secretariat to continue promoting private sector initiatives, including the D-8 Payment Card, the D-8 Creative Economy and Financial Center, and the D-8 New Generation Barter Trading. Urge all relevant ministries/agencies and institutions of Member States, to collaborate, closely, with the Secretariat to assess the feasibility of implementing these initiatives.
- 42. **Renew** our shared commitment to enhancing cooperation in disaster management, including strengthening joint efforts in disaster risk reduction, preparedness, and response, through collaborating on early warning systems, knowledge-sharing on best practices, and capacity-building initiatives to mitigate the impact of disasters.
- 43. **Underscore** our resolve to promote the economic empowerment of women, as a key driver of economic growth, and sustainable development, including enhancing opportunities for women in entrepreneurship, leadership, and the labor market, driven by the recognition of the vital role of women, in the economic and social progress of their nations, through eliminating barriers to women's economic participation, provide access to financial resources, and support initiatives that foster skills development and innovation, and task the D-8 Council, to work on this novel endeavor.
- 44. **Reaffirm** our opposition to any unilateral economic sanctions, imposed on D-8 Member States, that undermine global economic stability and violate international legal principles and demand the lifting of such sanctions.
- 45. **Support** the expansion of D-8 membership in accordance with Articles 3 and 4 of the D-8 Charter and appreciate the work concluded by the Council and the Commission to establish criteria and modalities for the new members and observers.
- 46. **Welcome** the Republic of Azerbaijan's accession as a full member in the D-8 Organization, and task the Council of Ministers to oversee the procedures related to its accession.
- 47. **Recognize** the importance of having a stronger and more efficient D-8 Secretariat, to ensure that our collective goals are effectively implemented and, therefore, call upon the Council of Ministers to implement mechanisms to strengthen the Secretariat's capacity and resources.



- 48. **Endorse** the nomination of the upcoming Secretary-General of the D-8, Ambassador Sohail Mahmood from the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, who will assume office on 1 January 2026.
- 49. **Welcome** the Republic of Indonesia as the next Chair of D-8, and profoundly appreciate its gracious offer to host the 12th D-8 Summit, the date and venue of which will be communicated in due course.
- 50. **Reaffirm** our commitment to promoting peace, prosperity, and sustainable development. In this era of unprecedented global challenges, we must work together to create a more resilient and inclusive future for our people, guided by the values of cooperation, mutual respect, and shared prosperity, and our shared resolve to continue our cooperation, under Egypt's leadership and remain committed to the vision outlined, in the D-8 Decennial Roadmap for 2020-2030.

Böylesine hassas bir dönemde gerçekleştirdiğimiz Zirvemizde alacağımız kararların, sorunların çözümünde bize rehberlik etmesini ümit ediyorum.

Toplantımızın temasını teşkil eden "GENÇLER ve KOBİ'LER" ülkemizin son 22 yıldır ekonomi alanında kaydettiği ilerlemenin de lokomotifi oldu.

Üye ülkelerimizdeki toplamda 1 milyardan fazla nüfusumuzun çok büyük kısmı gençlerden oluşuyor.

Hon'ble Chief Adviser Government of the Peoples' Republic of Bangladesh President of Arab Republic of Egypt, Excellency Abdel Fattah El-Sisi, Excellencies, Heads of State and Government, D-8 Secretary General,

Assalamu Alaikum.

I am delighted to join the 11th Summit of the D-8 Countries. Being in the fabled city of Cairo - at the confluence of history and heritage — is always a privilege and a delight.

My warmest felicitations to His Excellency President El-Sisi of the Arab Republic of Egypt, on your election.

Excellencies,

We meet at a time when the world is witnessing unprecedented challenges. Yet, so many opportunities beckon us as well.

The theme of the Summit, focusing on youth and the SMEs, aptly resonate with our shared aspirations.

Each of our countries has sizable youth population. Median age in Bangladesh, for instance, is just 27 years. Every year, around two and a half million young people enter the labour market. In a private sector driven economy, as we endevour to get them fit for the market or, encourage them to emerge as agile entrepreneurs, we see how emergence of technologies is posing challenges and opportunities like never before.

Manufacturing landscape in our countires has millions of workers who generally have low skills. But, the manufactruing and service economy of tommorrow is fast transforming, largely riding on artificial intelligence, machine learning, data-driven tools and applications. In Bangladesh, where agriculture is still a critical mainstay for the society and economy, we see how children of the majority of small farmers

are little interested to puruse back-breaking, risky and often uncertain farming-on-field the ways their parents took upon as a matter of tradition.

Travelling to rural Bangladesh, even across Asia, Africa and Arab world, I see how millions of today's youth are fast embracing technology and innovation, in everything around — either to turn around long-persistent challenges or, eke out newer opportunities that many thought impossible even few years before. Often, the younger folk show uncanny imagination in tacking intractable climatic stress on-the-field. I particularly underline this as our **agriculture** and **food** are changing about securing our economies, and creating wealth, within our own societies, with little outside inputs.

This brings into our consideration the millions of Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs). Most of the SMEs thrive within informal economy. They aspire to grow and connect to global supply chain. Most often, they lack formal structure, access to institutional finance or support architecture and are unfamiliar with market norms-practices-standards. Yet, I see how amazingly capable and competitive the SMEs are. In the D-8 coutries, collectively we possess enough of wealth, even in private phillathropy, to stand by these scores of SMEs. With our modest support, we can shape a virtuous 'cycle of good', for them and for our people. We need to let money flow to them, through de-risking finance, for instance.

Beyond what we discuss, let we, the D-8 Governments, convene candid, result-oriented conversation involving communities of youth – startups – business – finance; and see if we can curve out new platform amongst them. Bangladesh would be ready to take such an intiative forward; and convene a first multistakeholders meet in 2025.

Excellencies,

The ways the 'world of work' is evolving fast as the world of youth entreprenurship, the D-8 countries have to re-invent 'learning' to make rooms for your boys and girls to become leaders of the economy.

In our countries, we have great heritage, wisdom and accomplishments. We have to see how we can blend and build on those. We are yet to take fuller advantages of the digital revolution that has been with us for years. Now that using AI is here, let us think if we can leapfrog and catch up with the distruptions, to the advantage of our entrepreneurial boys and girls.

As way forward, I would like to propose two specific actions, for our consideration.

One, let us build and deepen functional, impact-driven connects between our Universities and equivalent knowledge institutions, particularly focused on preparing boys and girls into entrepreneurial other than its sake. Applied Science disciplines. We have to bring the entrepreneurs and higher learning much closer than what is today. Our aim should be to generate knowledge output that can produce global secure business and industry from leaders of D8 countries fiercely competitive global market place, with our niche. If this asks to re-look at the D-8 trade and investment frameworks afresh, we should do so. Transforming the business to impact on peoples' lives, not just an occupation to be our wealth. They will engage in social business to create a new civilization.

Second, for years, we tried to impart basic education and skills to millions in our countries through conventional in-person institutional architecture. In a 1.2 billion people, so often that is an increasingly daunting task. To reach 'scale', we tried through distance learning, for instance. We need to think deeper as to how to skill millions of young adults in workplace where right attitudes – values – ethics matter as much as hard skills. And, then we also confront the challenge to re-skill many millions at different vocational streams, on a continuous basis. Now that basic Albased tools and applications are accessible, let's think of a **cooperative learning agenda** that can complement our national undertakings.

Excellencies,

As we adopt the Cairo Declaration and the Summit outcome reflecting our collective aspiration and shared commitment to addressing pressing issues, I may call upon Excellencies to re-look at our collective agenda, afresh.

- 4. Our countries are blessed with bountiful resources and a vast amount of land. We have an abundant, talented, skilled labour force and diversified human capital. With a total population of 1.2 billion people or 15% of the world population, the market of the D-8 Member States is estimated to be valued at USD 2.1 trillion, accounting for 6.88% of the global trade total, which stands at USD 30.5 trillion in 2023. Unfortunately, our trading among the D-8 members are accounted at approximately USD 147 billion only.
- 5. As a grouping that addresses the social economics development of its Member States, and based on the fact that the global economy has shifted its direction, it is timely for us to relook into the areas of cooperation, and the economic achievements we have achieved thus far.

- 6. The future economic sectors are the halal-based industry, digital economy and green economy; where Al and sustainable, renewable energy are at the core of every discussion at every economic platform. These emerging economic sectors are poised for the D-8 countries to seize the opportunity. We must take decisive action to optimise our economic prospects in the digital economy and green economy without hesitation, or risk being left behind.
- 7. Hence, this is why the theme of today's Summit is befitting, in order for us to move ahead. "Investing in Youth and Supporting SMEs: Shaping Tomorrow's Economy", would allow us to deliberate on strategies that leverage the immense potential of our youth to drive the economies of D-8 Member States forward.

Malaysia's Initiatives in Investing in Youth and Supporting SMEs

Excellencies,

- 8. The theme of this Summit also aligns closely with the priorities of the Malaysia Madani Government, which recognises that the future of the Malaysian economy relies on the readiness of its youth and the resilience of its Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs).
- 9. Our youth represent the most valuable resource of our nations. Amidst the uncertainties, vulnerabilities, and disruptions of our time, their potential remains boundless. In this age of artificial intelligence, innovation, and disruptive technologies, it is essential that we not only equip our youth with technical skills but also nurture them into holistic individuals. A balanced education must integrate advanced competencies with moral and ethical

values. Compassion, humanity, and the dignity of humankind should remain at the core of our education systems, for a society bereft of these values is a society adrift.

10. SMEs are the backbone of economic resilience and innovation. Within the D-8 framework, strengthening SMEs and fostering cross-border collaborations in emerging industries, such as the halal economy, agribusiness, green technologies, and digital solutions, can unlock unprecedented opportunities.

Excellencies,

A Vision for Recalibrating D-8 Economic Cooperation

11. The current global economic climate compels us to recalibrate our D-8 economic cooperation with a forward-looking vision. This recalibration must prioritise

inclusivity and innovation, ensuring that no Member States or community is left behind. Our plans must address:

- i. Knowledge sharing to accelerate industrialisation;
- ii. Digital transformation and the integration of disruptive technologies into SMEs; and
- iii. Cross-border trade facilitation within D-8 markets to create seamless movement of goods and services.

Excellencies,

Outcome Documents of 11th D-8 Summit

12. Malaysia supports the Cairo Declaration and the Joint Communiqué on the Situation in Palestine and Lebanon. The adoption of the Cairo Declaration affirms our commitment to D-8.

- 13. Additionally, by endorsing the Joint Communiqué, we reinforce our collective resolve and unity in advocating for the rights and dignity of the Palestinian people, who have faced unimaginable suffering, including indiscriminate killings and acts of genocide perpetrated by the domineering and oppressive regime of the Zionist Israel.
- 14. As a united bloc, we must rally together to provide scholarships, vocational training, and start-up programmes specifically tailored to empower Palestinian youth. Let us help them rebuild their futures and restore their dignity.

Closing

15. In conclusion, Malaysia reaffirms our unwavering commitment to the D-8 Organisation and stands prepared to work collaboratively and strategically with all Member States. Together, we aim to advance the organisation's

objectives, fostering tangible improvements in the socioeconomic well-being of our nations and their people.

- 16. Let us combine our efforts to work together and shape the future through:
 - i. First: Cultivate a generation of innovation and compassionate leaders;
 - ii. Second: Build resilient economies that thrive amidst uncertainty;
 - iii. Third: Reinforce the bonds with solidarity, compassion and shared humanity, that define us part of a global community.
- 17. May the D-8 rise as a beacon of hope not just for ourselves, but for the world at large.

- 7. Small and Medium Enterprises (SME) have remained a catalyst for job creation in developing economies on all necessary effort must be sustained towards the consolidation of the SMEs as primary enebalers of sustainable growth and development of our economies.

In accordance with the principles of this Organisation and in support of the joint declaration of the extraordinary meeting of the D-8 Council of Ministers on the situation in Gaza, which is in line with Nigeria's position, I call on all Member States of this Organisation to redouble efforts towards achieving a peaceful settlement of the Palestinian question on the basis of a two-State solution.
- 14. To energise our resolve for shared prosperity among countries of the global south, through cooperation and partnerships in the face of everchanging geopolitical dynamics, I wish to encourage us to accord the desired attention to the expansion of our membership, in a manner that aligns with our fundamental aspirations.

This 11th Summit of D-8 Organization for Economic Cooperation is being held at a crucial time, when the pressing global challenges and emerging opportunities call for strong collective efforts from our Member States. The current global economic outlook is profoundly influenced by geopolitical tensions, particularly the relentless and brutal crimes of aggression and genocide being committed by Israel, the occupying power, against the peoples of Palestine and Lebanon, which resulted in immense lives lost, humanitarian catastrophe, widespread destruction of vital infrastructures and mass displacement of millions of people. In this context, we affirm the responsibility of the international community to implement the UN Security Council Resolution No.2735, impose

immediate, permanent and unconditional ceasefire, ensure delivery of humanitarian assistance in full-scale to Gaza Strip, and support for the legitimate rights of the Palestinian people for self-determination and establishment of their independent Palestinian State on the 1967 borders with East Jerusalem as its capital.

Undoubtedly, these developments negatively impact the economy, both globally and for individual countries. Accordingly, the proceedings of this Summit are of significant importance to the OIC, since all the eight Member-States of D8 Organization for Economic Cooperation belong to the OIC and represent about 63% of OIC total population and 55% of their total Gross Domestic Production (GDP). In addition, the two Organizations share common economic objectives and are desirous of collaborating in such areas as agriculture and food security, trade, tourism and transportation.

It should be mentioned here that the mutual desire to collaborate was concretized by concluding a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the two Organizations in Istanbul, Republic of Türkiye, on 7th October 2010. With your continued support, I pledge to discharge my duties with dedication until the conclusion of my term next year. The Egyptian D-8 Presidency comes at a pivotal moment for two

reasons.

First, we are recovering from the unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic, which underscored the necessity of collaboration in addressing global challenges. Second, conflicts persist globally, including the deeply concerning situations in Palestine and Lebanon. Egypt's resolve to host this Summit and dedicate a special session to these crises is highly commendable.

Since taking office, I have prioritized innovative approaches to strengthen cooperation, particularly through enhanced private-sector engagement and integration with public sectors. This has boosted intra-trade cooperation and enhanced the visibility of the D-8 both within member states and globally.

We have achieved significant milestones in several key areas:

Trade: The D-8 Preferential Trade Agreement (D-8 PTA) has been effectively implemented by Türkiye and Indonesia, with Egypt set to join as a Contracting Member. Additionally, the Dispute Settlement Mechanism Protocol was finalized this year and is gaining traction among member states.

Tourism: Our tourism cooperation agenda advanced with the successful 3rd Ministerial Meeting on Tourism in Pakistan and the launch of the D-8 Tourism City of the Year Award, with Antalya, Türkiye, as the inaugural recipient for 2025.

Agriculture: We organized workshops on climate-smart agriculture and inaugurated the D-8 Research Center for Agriculture and Food Security in Faisalabad, Pakistan. Furthermore, an MoU with the Islamic Organization for Food Security was finalized.

Youth: The First D-8 Youth Ministers Meeting was successfully hosted by Bangladesh, with plans underway to launch the D-8 Youth Council. Nigeria is set to host the second meeting in 2025.

External Relations: We have forged impactful collaborations with international organizations like the UN, OIC, and ECO, focusing on e-Government networks, SME development, and capacity-building.

Private-Sector Engagement: Initiatives such as the Super App project with Al-Hidayah Group and the New Generation Barter Trading System are expected to significantly contribute to member economies.

Honourable Chairman, Excellencies, Esteemed Leaders,

To further our economic integration, I propose the following strategic initiatives:

D-8 Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA): This initiative aims to deepen economic integration. Implementing the D-8 Visa Agreement will be crucial for its success.

D-8 Development Fund: Establishing this fund will catalyze innovative projects proposed by entrepreneurs across member states. I request your support in directing relevant entities to

collaborate with the Secretariat on a comprehensive feasibility study.

Support for SME Development: SMEs are the backbone of our economies, and I call upon our leaders to bolster their capacity through microfinance, e-commerce facilitation, industrial parks, and streamlined regulatory processes. The establishment of the D-8 Centre for SMEs in Nigeria and the D-8 Youth Council in Bangladesh will benefit greatly from your political support.

In conclusion, the D-8 Organization remains a beacon of prosperity and inclusive economic development for the Global South. With collective commitment, we can bring tangible socioeconomic progress to our nations. My team and I at the D-8 Secretariat stand ready to facilitate this noble quest.

I am confident that under the leadership of His Excellency

President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi, the D-8 Organization will

continue advancing its goals. I extend my best wishes to my

successor from Pakistan, who will assume office on 1 January 2026.

Finally, I express my heartfelt appreciation to all leaders and participants at this Summit and extend our gratitude to the Republic of Türkiye for their generosity in hosting the Secretariat in Istanbul.

تعيش المنطقة العربية لحظة قد تكون هي الأخطر في تاريخها الحديث. ولا يخفي علينا جميعاً قدر تعقد الأزمات التي تواجهها، وتشابكها وتسارع انفجارها.

لقد أثبتت أحداث العام المنصرم، بكل مصاعبها وآلامها، أن بقاء الأزمات من دون حل. أو تجميد الصراعات من غير تسوية... هو طريق محفوف بالمخاطر، ولا يوفر سوى أمان خادع، واستقرار هش قابل للانفجار في أي لحظة.

ومن الواضح أن دولة الاحتلال هي الطرف الوحيد الذي لا يُريد الاعتراف بهذه الحقيقة. إذ تتصور إسرائيل أن العدوان الوحشي على المدنيين سيقود إلى استدامة الاحتلال... وأن القوة تجلب السلام والأمن ..وحقيقة الأمر أن هذا محض وهم... وإلا ما رأينا انفجار الأوضاع على نحو ما صار في العام الماضي... وستظل الأوضاع قابلة للانفجار ..وسيظل الأمن هشاً والسلام مفقوداً طالما لم يُمارس الشعب الفلسطيني حقه في تقرير مصيره في دولة مستقلة، أسوة بكل شعوب الدنيا التي تخلصت من نير الاحتلال.

فضحايا العدوان على غزة ليسوا فقط الفلسطينيين الذين قتل وجُرح منهم مئات الآلاف ..وهُجر ملايين، مرة بعد مرة ... وإنما أيضاً القانون الدولي والقانون الإنساني الدولي ومبادئ العدالة.. كانت كلها ضحية لهذا العدوان.. وسيكون لعجز العالم عن التعامل مع استهزاء إسرائيل بكل معاني القانون والإنسانية تبعات خطيرة على النظام العالمي وقواعده في المستقبل، إذ فقدت هذه المعاني قدسيتها ورمزيتها بعد أن انتُهكت في غزة على مرأى ومشهد من العالم كله.

رابعاً: تدشين اجتماعات دورية لوزراء الصحة بالدول الأعضاء واستضافة مصر للاجتماع الأول عام 2025 لمناقشة سبل تعظيم الاستفادة من التطبيقات التكنولوجية والعلمية المتطورة لتطوير هذا القطاع المهم.
